CW Chu College, The Chinese University of Hong Kong Summer Programme at Utrecht University, the Netherlands (In collaboration with the GOAL Programme of United College)

Programme Features:

This 2-week summer course is organised by Utrecht University (Summer School), the Netherlands, for the students of the College. Students may choose to attend any one of the following courses:

(1) European Cultures and Identities

(2) European Politics and Economy

Students are required to attend lectures in the mornings. Seminars, tutorials, presentation sessions and simulation games will be arranged in the afternoons to enable students to have free exchange of ideas. These courses will also include 1-day field excursion.

Duration: 4 - 18 July 2020

Fees: HK\$19,500* per student. This will cover round-trip airfare, academic programme and course materials, compulsory excursions

and accommodation at the student dormitory of Utrecht. Fees such as local transport, visa application, meals and students' daily expenses are not included.

Accommodation: All students will be housed in the student hostels of Utrecht University.

Eligibility: Regular students of CW Chu College of all disciplines and years are eligible to apply.

Quota: 5 students

Scholarships: Upon completion of the trip and fulfillment of all the programme requirements, the College will provide a subsidy of up to HK\$10,000 to each participant on need and/or merit basis.

Credit Transfer: Upon fulfilment of the programme requirements, students can apply for credit transfer (equivalent to 3 CUHK units); these units will NOT be tied to any specific course exemptions, but will be counted as general electives towards the credits required for graduation.

Objectives & Content:

(1) European Cultures and Identities

This course offers students an introduction to Europe, a continent of great diversity. The themes covered in the course will help students understand the complicated structure of Europe. It will shed some light on the motives for integration as well as the obstacles on the way to European unity. Students will come across topics such as the emergence and construction of national identities, national identity versus European identity, the cultural heritage of Europe, and the processes of globalization and transnational collaboration. Lectures will focus on the history, social and economic structures, culture, and current political and social debates within the wider European community. Excursion to related establishments is included in the programme.

(2) European Politics and Economy

This course offers students an introduction to the political landscape of Europe. The European Union (EU) is a political partnership between 28 democratic European countries. With almost 500 million citizens, it has become a major player in global politics. In this course, European Union is the main object of study. Students will be introduced to the EU's history, institutional structures, current aims, and future challenges, they will also learn the historical background and the various stages of integration. Other themes that students will examine include the role of European leaders, the future political expansion of the EU, transatlantic relations and the development of a shared foreign policy and development aid. Excursion to related establishments is included in the programme.

*This course requires basic knowledge about European politics and history.

Programme Requirements / Assessment:

All participants are required to:

- attend all the pre-departure lectures, briefings, meetings organised by the CWC/ UC to prepare themselves for the Summer Programme;
- attend all the lectures, seminars, presentation and compulsory excursions organised by the Utrecht University, the Netherlands;
- complete all the assignments (oral presentation and written assignments);
- assist the College in the promotion of cultural exchange activities;
- share with other students their experience in Utrecht;
- submit a written report to the College after the Programme. The College reserves the right to edit the report for publication purposes.
