# FOREWORD

The year 2022 has marked important milestones not just for the revival of on-campus teaching and learning activities; it has also, via those activities, called forth among our students moments of reflections that would have meaningful implications as they prepare for the world beyond university.

Being back on campus means much more than switching back to classrooms and lecture theatres. While knowledge can now be disseminated regardless of modes — virtual, physical, or hybrid — we should be reminded that non-formal education also constitutes a core component in undergraduate education and training, in which values are most effectively inculcated via interpersonal communication.

To study and live together in a fully residential college means students must learn to connect with others and with themselves. Our tech-savvy generation would have no problem completing course requirements remotely; there are capacities beyond the visible, however, that must be acquired and strengthened via interactions with others, face-to-face and unfiltered by a digital screen. These interactions allow us (and require us) to be individuals who can communicate well within groups while forming individuality, who can be compassionate while retaining one's character. As members of the College, our students thus participate in non-formal activities that contribute to an indispensable portion of whole-person development, alongside the acquisition of academic knowledge.

This 'journey back to normal' will not be as instantaneous as leaving Zoom and showing up in classrooms, and will entail challenges that must be overcome with resilience, persistence and adaptability. Having missed many opportunities for real-world interactions over the past few years, and spoiled by the convenience of the virtual world, new and returning students might suddenly find themselves inundated with possibilities, temptations, and commitments that ask for careful assessment and better planning, all the while remaining observant of any changes induced by the virus. Students must learn to cope and live with unpredictability amid a myriad of choices available on and off campus.

In the long run, we hope such capacity and resilience building will form a strong foundation for students as they continue to embrace the dynamism required of life. With the pandemic still making headlines, I encourage students to cherish this period of recovery to make the most of university life, being conscious of the true value of social interactions and self-discovery that the screens of their laptops and smart phones cannot offer.

As I present this *Report* on the College's development over the past year, I am reminded of all our benefactors, teachers, and staff, who together have supported us throughout these challenging years, without whom many of the activities and initiatives covered in the follow pages would not have been possible. May I express our deepest gratitude to you all as we look forward to another year of recovery and progress.

In 2021, degrees were conferred in decentralised ceremonies held separately by the Colleges and Faculties to maintain social distancing. A total of 42 graduates attended the 90th Congregation (Conferment of Bachelor's Degrees) of The Chinese University of Hong Kong *cum* Graduation Ceremony of CW Chu College 2020–21, held on 4 November 2021, presided over by Prof Wai-Yee CHAN, Pro-Vice-Chancellor of CUHK, at Chong Kin Wo Hall. Live broadcast was arranged for attending guests.

In her welcoming remarks, Prof Suk-Ying WONG, College Master, commended graduates for completing their studies against the many challenges their cohort faced over the previous years. She encouraged them to explore different opportunities, and to exercise sagacious judgment on things that are worthy of their lifelong attention in the face of uncertainties.

Assistant Dean (External Affairs) and Associate Professor of the Faculty of Medicine, Prof Jeremy TEOH has been appointed concurrently as Warden of the CW Chu College Student Hostel with effect from 1 September 2022 for a term of two years. Since joining the College in 2017, Prof TEOH has been contributing to the College extensively as members of several committees, including College Life, General Education, Mentorship and Internship, Staffing and Budget, Student Affairs, and most recently Hostel, Building and Campus Management. The College is delighted to welcome Prof TEOH as Warden, whose enthusiasm and commitment, together with his team of Resident Tutors, shall inspire our intimate resident community.

Prof TEOH received his bachelor's degree from the University of Hong Kong. He was awarded Ten Outstanding Young Persons Award (Hong Kong) and the SIU-Innovators Award in 2021. With primary research interests in bladder cancer and prostate cancer, he has received numerous research grants and has published extensively. He is an editorial board member for a number of prominent academic journals, and he has been serving as a member for several advisory boards for prostate cancer and bladder cancer. He was the Chairperson of the Younger Fellows Chapter of the College of Surgeons of Hong Kong (2019–2021), the Chair of the Young Fellows Chapter of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (2021–2022), and he has been the Director of the Lions Kidney Educational Centre and Research Foundation since 2016. As founder of the UroSoMe (Urology Social Media) working group, he believes that social media plays an important role in the modern era of medicine.

## MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN OF STUDENTS

### Re-learning to socialise and engage in the real world

The past few months have been both rejuvenating and challenging in positive ways. We have enjoyed a full semester of on-campus teaching and events — over 40 events at the College alone — that meets, if not beats, the pre-COVID level. Meanwhile, both students and teachers found themselves adjusting to this ‘new normal’ that sees a strange mix of gradually expanding socialising and ever-present virus-control measures, navigating between classrooms and Zoom, masked up and no mask.

The resumption of communal dining and High Table Dinner — both signature events of our fully residential character — represents much more than merely having meals together and meeting up. Students on the one hand have been able to mingle intimately through dinners, events and many chance encounters in the communal area; on the other hand, many had to re-learn living under the same roof and meeting each other frequently in the real, non-virtual world, while speaking eloquently in front of real people — no more turning-off-the-camera option! These brief, seemingly insignificant interactions combined will contribute significantly to a rewarding university journey marked by active engagement and care for the community.

Equally important as being engaged interpersonally is the ability to be reflective at the intellectual level. At the College we endeavour to inspire students to go beyond their immediate professional milieu, and to be creative with coming up with novel ideas and solutions. To achieve these goals, we host sharing sessions where people from different backgrounds meet and exchange views (in various forms, such as night talks, workshops, festive celebration, and casual meetups); we explore seemingly simple ‘questions’ we face on a daily basis alongside discussions of a higher order, and analyse and discover the many facets of an issue — however common and mundane at first glance — that prompt our imagination and investigative appetite. Through these moments of spark we get to know each other better, form deeper understanding and connection, and learn to appreciate and cherish diversity. It gives me much delight to be able to observe and be part of our students' growth.

About a year ago, I was writing a similar message hoping that we would soon be at the end of the long COVID tunnel. Fast-forwarding to now, although the virus is still with us, we have been extremely grateful for having concluded a semester of vibrant face-to-face activities and cultural exchanges, and are looking forward to the New Year as social distancing measures continue to relax. Let's keep our fingers crossed as we go through the tunnel towards the light.




## OUR ELEVENTH COHORT



According to University policy, students were recruited through three major channels: local students, mostly through the Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS), students admitted from the mainland through the *gaokao* (高考) system, and students admitted with international qualifications, such as GCE, IB, and SAT.

A total of 75 students have been admitted in the eleventh cohort. The distribution is as follows.




## INCOMING EXCHANGE STUDENTS

### Term 2, Academic Year 2021–22

A virtual session, attended by college teachers and staff, was held on 7 January 2022 to welcome 13 incoming exchange students of Term 2, 2021–22 coming from Canada, China, Hungary, Japan, South Korea, the UK, and the US. These students received welcome gifts of coffee drip bags presented in special packaging of *Hong Kong Impressions* — reproductions of paintings by Hong Kong artist Mr YIP Yan-chuen in the CUHK Art Museum collection, as well as a set of Cantonese idiom postcards with illustrations and English translations created by students of the founding cohort in their final year project.

### Term 1, Academic Year 2022–23

The College hosted an online session on 2 September 2022 to welcome a total of 21 incoming exchange students joining CWC in Term 1, 2022–23 (8 of them will stay for the whole academic year). They came from diverse backgrounds: Austria, Denmark, France, Germany, Japan, South Korea, the Netherlands, the UK, and the US. They received a warm welcome from the College Master, the Dean of Students, the Warden, the Chair of the External Links and Exchange Committee Prof Andrew CHAN, Prof Wai-Yee CHAN, and Prof Kenneth YOUNG. Students had a cordial exchange with our teachers and learnt about a host of on-campus events that await them.



## SCHOLARSHIPS AND PRIZES

Thanks to the generous donations from benefactors and friends of the College, many scholarships are available to our students. In 2021–22, 70 scholarships were awarded to students for their excellent academic performance, and to students to support their participation in outbound exchange programmes and overseas summer activities.

The College also awarded certificates to members of our student bodies to show appreciation for their contributions to the community. They include: the Eighth Representative Council of the Student Union, the Sixth Residents' Association, the Ninth Student Honour Code Committee, and the Ninth CW Chu College Service Team.

Resident tutors and a few students from previous cohorts were invited to join as facilitators. Participants exchanged views and ideas in a casual and relaxing setting. The Cantonese Session took place on 13 September, and the Putonghua and the English ones on 22 September.



#### Meetings with Student Representatives and Residents (October 2022)

The College Master, the Dean of Students, and the Warden met with different groups of students to discuss various College matters and to strengthen the bonding among College members.

On 17 October 2022, they had a meeting with the Eighth Representative Council of the Student Union of CW Chu College and the Seventh Residents' Association. They exchanged views and updates over a number of College matters.

On 24 October 2022, they co-hosted a 'Forum on Hostel Living' focused on the updates and exchange of views on matters surrounding hostel living, College activities, and CWC culture.



# ORIENTATION ACTIVITIES

## College Orientation Camp 2022

The College Orientation Camp (O' Camp) in summer 2022 regained its usual buoyancy with the gradual resumption of on-campus activities. New students received a warm welcome from the O' Camp Organising Committee (OC) and College teachers at the virtual opening ceremony on 30 August, followed by a memorable two-day O' Camp on campus. A closing ceremony was held on 1 September where College students (both newly admitted and their seniors) spent moments of joy chatting with College teachers and affiliates, and learnt about the many opportunities that await them in the years ahead.

## PEER MENTORING PROGRAM

The College has been participating in the Peer Mentoring Program organised by The Independent Learning Centre (ILC) of the University for many years. The Program runs through Term 1 of each academic year, where new students, participating as peer mentees, are helped in their transition to university life by individually matched peer mentors from previous cohorts. Through the Program, mentees developed study skills and were introduced to available learning resources; mentors developed training, counselling, and communication skills.

In 2022–23, a total of 14 peer mentees were matched with 9 peer mentors. On 5 October 2022, Dr Yvonne LOONG, Senior Lecturer of the ILC, hosted a training session for mentees. ILC also organised a series of training sessions for mentors. Mentors and mentees communicated via different channels during the term. On 22 November 2022, a ceremony was held at Chong Kin Wo Hall to present certificates to mentors; the ceremony was attended by Dr LOONG as the guest of honour and Prof Vincent CHEUNG, Dean of Students.



# EDUCATION AND PERSONAL GROWTH

## GENERAL EDUCATION

The General Education Programme at CW Chu College consists of a credit-bearing component and a non-formal component that carries no credit units (required Extended Orientation for Year 1 students and communal dining including High Table Dinners, and voluntary social service).

The credit-bearing component includes an induction course for Year 1 students, and a capstone course. The latter, after a major review, has been piloted since Term 1, 2022–23, in a revised form.

### Induction Course

As a key component of the first-year learning experience, the induction course, **GECW1010 University and Society**, is taught in English (with flexibility in tutorials), so that students from different academic origins share the same educational experience. Altogether 11 teachers have contributed to the teaching of this course in 2022–23. They are (teachers and administrators affiliated to the College) Prof Peter FERRETTO, Ms Sue FUNG, Prof Stephen HALL, Prof Martin TSUI, Prof Winnie TSUI, Prof Suk-Ying WONG, Prof Kenneth YOUNG; (guest speakers from the Department of History and The Independent Learning Centre) Prof LEUNG Yuen Sang and Dr Yvonne LOONG; and also (part-time lecturer and part-time instructor) Dr Flora MAK and Mr SUN Lei. In addition, as an initiative in English Across the Curriculum, the English Language Teaching Unit (ELTU) collaborated with the College to host an English writing workshop as part of the course; the workshop was delivered on two occasions, each time to half the class, by Mr Oliver YUNG of ELTU. The default mode of teaching in Term 1, 2022–23 was face-to-face. Synchronous Zoom lectures were provided for students subject to quarantine.

### Capstone Course

The capstone course is designed to allow students to synthesise their academic skills beyond the limits of the major programme, engage with a real-life issue of relevance to society, analyse the factors, constraints and options, and present their findings in a cogent, reasoned and persuasive manner. Students are expected to learn and participate actively especially through presentations, group work and the writing of a project report.

### Piloting Service Learning in College General Education

With the introduction of Credit-Bearing Service Learning Programme by the University, where Service Learning is scheduled to become a requirement for students entering in 2024 and thereafter, CW Chu College has reviewed the original capstone course GECW4010 *Senior Seminar*, which was designed in the past for Year 3 students to complete during the ensuing summer, with formal registration in the following term. Starting from Term 1, 2022–23, GECW4010 is replaced by **GECW4021 College Project** and **GECW4022 College Project (Service)** as two available options, with another 0-credit course (**GECW4030 Service**) targeting service opportunities of a smaller scale to be implemented. The new course structure also allows greater flexibility in timing, being open to students from Year 1 to Year 3.

The College teachers who contributed to the teaching of GECW4021 and GECW4022 in 2022–23 are Prof CHAIR Sek Ying, Prof Vincent CHEUNG, Dr Yannie CHEUNG, Prof Cecilia CHUN, Prof JIANG Yuanan, Dr Kiang Kai Ming, Prof Owen KO, Dr LAI Hei Ming, Dr Alvin LEUNG, Prof Amos TAI, Prof Jeremy TEOH, Prof Suk-Ying WONG, and Prof Kenneth YOUNG. In addition, Mr Howard LING was invited to provide guidance for one specific service project.

A higher degree of flexibility has been introduced to the non-formal component of College General Education, where students may satisfy part of requirements within the non-credit bearing courses (GECW1000, 2000, 3000 and 4000) with participation in activities accepted by the College.

### General Education Best Essay Award 2020–21

Ms WONG Hoi Lam (Year 4, Biomedical Engineering) was granted the General Education Best Essay Award 2020–21 (Merit Award) organised by the Office of University General Education, for her outstanding essay entitled 'Planning a "Good" Life: the Blueprint and Difficulties of Actualising it from the Perspective of Human Nature' (《從人性本質看「美好」人生的藍本、困難與實踐》) in the General Education Foundation course 'In Dialogue with Humanity'.

## EXTENDED ORIENTATION

The Extended Orientation is a series of four sessions organised for Year 1 students on the first few Fridays in September every year. It is part of the College's non-credit bearing General Education Programme (GECW1000), supplementing the Orientation Camp and activities run by the students themselves. It covers various topics essential for college and university life, providing new students with guidance and support, and facilitating their transition to university life.



# MENTORSHIP, CAREER AND INTERNSHIPS

To encourage students to explore beyond their own milieu, the Mentorship Scheme and Internship Scheme, established since the founding cohorts, have grown in scale and thrived with the support of mentors and internship providers who have generously offered their expertise, time and resources in educating students outside the classroom. In recent years, to this foundation were added the *To the Workplace* programme and a host of career workshops, speakers series and related resources to prepare students for the world beyond university.

## Mentorship Scheme

For the Mentorship Scheme 2021–22, a total of 14 seasoned professionals from various fields and sectors agreed to be mentors. They were matched with 21 College students participating as mentees. An online briefing session was hosted by Prof Vincent CHEUNG, Dean of Students, on 25 April 2022 to introduce the Scheme objectives, intended learning outcomes, and timeline. Mr SHEK Hiu Fung (Chinese Language Studies and Chinese Language Education) and Mr YE Haiyu (Quantitative Finance and Risk Management Science) were invited to share their rewarding experience joining the Scheme.


Due to the pandemic, mentors and mentees were first connected via online platforms in lieu of a physical launch ceremony and a tea gathering.



## Workshops on Getting Ready for the Workplace


### Speakers Series — Learn from Professionals and an Alumnus (11 and 13 April 2022)

The annual Speakers Series aims to encourage junior students, especially those in Year 1, to have early plans for the workplace. Workshops were conducted online on two evenings.




In Session 1 on 11 April 2022, Prof Kenneth YOUNG encouraged students to plan ahead in filling the gaps between their current competencies and the expectations of their future careers. The second speaker, Ms Ivy KWOK from Career Planning and Development Centre, Office of Student Affairs, CUHK guided students on career planning one step at a time and introduced available resources at the University.

In Session 2 on 13 April 2022, Mr Wilfred WONG, Founder and Managing Director, RESOLUTIONS HR & Business Consultancy Co. Ltd., introduced students to the four 'C's expected of junior employees: **C**ritical thinking, **C**reativity, **C**ollaboration, and **C**ommunication, citing vivid examples from different industries. Emergent trends were discussed. Mr Matthew LI, Class of 2019 (Global Economics and Finance), and now Customer Experience Manager at HSBC, shared his job application experience. He gave students tips to set themselves apart from the rest, both during the job application process and after being on board.



### Workshop on CV Writing (21 April 2022)

A Workshop on CV Writing was conducted online on 21 April 2022. Ms Tessa STEWART, a seasoned language trainer and long-time supporter of the College, served as instructor to guide students on what to include in their CVs. Concepts of a personal statement, keywords and transferable skills were introduced and explored in detail with examples. The importance of networking and staying positive was highlighted. Students were encouraged to submit their CVs to Ms STEWART for online coaching.



### Internship Scheme

The College Summer Internship Scheme 2022 was open for application in early March 2022. College students were introduced to a total of 28 summer internship openings from six companies/ organisations across various fields, such as asset management, programming, education, marketing, science and finance. Applications were received from 11 students.

## Service Activities

### Warm Gifts to CWC Janitors

### Visits to the Homeless in Sham Shui Po (September 2022)

As part of the GECW4022 College Service Project, the Service Team organised three visits to Tung Chau Street of Sham Shui Po on 1, 8 and 30 September 2022 with the guidance of Chu Kong Plan (曙光計劃). The Service Team raised funds through Instagram and distributed supplies — snacks, water, festive mooncakes and hygiene products — to the homeless.



### Summer Service Project 2022

With generous support from The D. H. Chen Foundation, the College Service Team has launched its annual service projects smoothly throughout the years, making a positive influence on the lives of both university and secondary school participants of the projects.

The Tenth CWC Service Team launched its summer service project entitled 'Understanding Socially Disadvantaged School Youths through a Social Service Endeavour 2022' with the theme 'Trees in City' from late July to August 2022. Serving as mentors, Team members interacted with students from both PLK CW Chu College (PLKCWC) and HHCKLA Buddhist Ching Kok Secondary School (BCKSS), who participated in this project as mentees.

This year, the Service Team engaged professional services from the International Society of Arboriculture Hong Kong Chapter (ISA) to organise a series of activities. Ms Qianhoong LEE from the ROCK Training Consultants was invited to hold a leadership training session for the Service Team on 28 July 2022 to introduce skills for building trust and credibility with mentees, for effective communication, and for formulating action commitments.

On 30 July 2022, student participants met their group leaders for the first time and experienced a two-hour tour at Kowloon Park led by ISA experts. Knowledge of urban greenery such as trees maintenance, cultural and historical background, and career pathways were introduced.

A meeting was held on 6 August 2022 at CUHK where participating students were introduced to different options and pathways in life. Team members and ISA experts shared their personal stories, passion for and experience from study and work. Participating students also received guidance on the final project task — to produce a booklet on an assigned topic — and proceeded to work in groups with the Service Team to create the booklet from early to mid-August.

A debriefing session was held at CUHK on 27 August 2022, attended by the participating students and their teacher representatives, Prof Vincent CHEUNG (Chair of Service Committee), and Mr Hincen NG (President, ISA). Prof CHEUNG gave a closing speech and the participants presented their final product. Through the summer service project, students were encouraged to explore possibilities in life, built self-confidence and honed communication skills.



# EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

## COMMUNAL DINING

Communal dining is an integral part of student life at the College where they dine together every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday during term time. Attendance contributes to the non-credit bearing courses (GECW1000, 2000, 3000 and 4000) as part of the non-formal component of College General Education. During the pandemic, with dining plans subject to change, alternative arrangements have been introduced to allow for greater flexibility.

### Term 2, Academic Year 2021–22

A 'Mini Meal Plan' was adopted in January 2022 in the light of social distancing measures. Communal dining was then suspended for the rest of Term 2 as the pandemic worsened. Students satisfied their remaining requirements of the non-credit bearing courses by joining activities accepted by the College.

### Term 1, Academic Year 2022–23

Communal dinners were first served in the form of meal boxes in September 2022. With the gradual relaxation in regulations, dining resumed at Chong Kin Wo Hall beginning 5 October 2022 and for the remainder of the term. Rapid antigen test (RAT) kits were distributed, and meal plan participants would present record of negative RAT results for admission. Students satisfied requirements of the non-credit bearing courses by attending at least 50% of the communal dinners and joining two activities accepted by the College.



# COLLEGE FOUNDERS' DAY AND HIGH TABLE DINNER

## Academic Year 2021–22

The annual celebration of Founders' day in November was cancelled in 2021 because of the pandemic. All scheduled High Table Dinners in the academic year 2021–22 were also cancelled.

## Term 1, Academic Year 2022–23

### First High Table Dinner and Celebration for the Founders' Day

17 November 2022 (Thursday), Chong Kin Wo Hall



With the resumption of campus activities and dining arrangements, the College successfully organised a much-anticipated High Table Dinner — the first in over two and a half years.

Members of the Committee of Overseers, teachers, guests and students attended this High Table Dinner to celebrate the College Founders' Day 2022. Mr LEUNG Wing Mo, Former Assistant Director of the Hong Kong Observatory, was the guest of honour and addressed the audience on issues of sustainability and climate change with reference to the UN Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP27) in Egypt.

Introducing students to the history of COP, Mr LEUNG highlighted its relevance to current climate issues — from the environmental to the political perspectives — and illustrated the topic of rising temperatures with cases including coral reefs die-off and disintegration of the West Antarctic ice sheet, among others, and their ensuing impact on the environment and our society. He concluded on a positive note by inviting participants 'to avoid the unmanageable, and to manage the unavoidable', by thinking twice before engaging in activities that would increase carbon footprints.



## TALKS AND WORKSHOPS

The College organised talks and workshops on a large variety of topics to broaden students' horizons.

### Term 2, Academic Year 2021–22

#### Night Talk — How to Survive and Succeed in the Fast-Changing Tech World (31 March 2022)


Dr Alfred NG gave a night talk on 31 March 2022 on the topic of *How to Survive and Succeed in the Fast-Changing Tech World*. An accomplished computer scientist and entrepreneur with experience gained in both Asia and North America, Dr NG introduced key steps for research in technological advancement, citing examples from the 'AI pet face recognition' technology which he developed.

Dr NG expounded on how to quickly zero in on problems in order to survive in a fast-paced environment. He introduced mini proof-of-concept projects for testing initial ideas. Using real-world examples, he showed how invention and project development could be fraught with setbacks and ensuing rounds of refinement, tackling issues of pricing, cost-effectiveness, user experience, and more. Students gained useful insights on the world of technology and on the role of problem-solving in the path to success.

#### Night Talk — Psychology of Socialising (20 April 2022)

Mr Mills WONG, an Industrial-Organisational Psychologist, gave a talk on 20 April 2022 to introduce the psychology behind how we socialise with others. Drawing on his experience as radio host (RTHK: 《捉心理》), columnist (*Mind & Life* 《心活誌》), manager in major multinational corporations and in a global consulting firm, Mr WONG stressed the importance of identifying 'similarities' with others — be it appearance, personality, social background, or common interests, and he emphasised the roles of competence, passion and integrity in trust building, citing immediate examples of interactions in different relationships and settings.

Our young audience learnt to question pre-existing beliefs on what makes a person attractive, and were reminded of the value of virtues — trust, politeness, appreciation, integrity — for psychological well-being.



## Term 1, Academic Year 2022–23

### Briefing on Major Scholarships, Awards and Financial Aid (27 September 2022)

The briefing session was conducted by Prof Suk-Ying WONG, College Master. Participants were introduced to various types of scholarships and financial aid, successful cases of College students being awarded scholarships, useful tips on applying to scholarships and preparing for an interview, as well as resources available.



### Night Talk in Honour of Professor YANG Chen Ning's 100th Birthday:

#### 《破宇稱 立規範 —— 介紹楊振寧教授最重要的兩項工作》 (28 September 2022)

On 28 September 2022, Prof Kenneth YOUNG gave a night talk on Prof YANG Chen Ning, one of the most celebrated theoretical physicists of the contemporary era, and on Prof YANG's work on parity non-conservation in weak interactions (Nobel Prize in Physics in 1957 together with Prof TD LEE) and on Yang–Mills theory, which now lies at the heart of fundamental physics. The talk was given as part of the celebration of Prof YANG's 100th birthday just a few days thereafter.

The talk also highlighted Prof YANG's long association with CUHK, beginning with a public lecture hosted by CUHK back in 1964. He gave many public lectures at CUHK in the 1980s, was appointed Honorary Professor in 1982, Distinguished Professor-at-Large in 1986, and was awarded Doctor of Science, *honoris causa*, in 1997. Through a video recorded by Prof YANG and addressed to CUHK teachers and students, the audience caught a glimpse of his cheerfulness and close relationship with CUHK.



### Night Talk — What Makes a City Cultural? (29 September 2022)

Mr Louis YU, a seasoned arts administrator and Director of the Hong Kong Art School, spoke to College students on 29 September 2022 on *What makes a city cultural?* The talk was based on a lecture of the same title first given in 2020 and because of its popularity in the cultural sector delivered multiple times; this occasion being the 60th. With a wealth of experience from his previous roles — Executive Director of West Kowloon Cultural District, Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Arts Development Council, and the Executive Director of the Hong Kong Arts Centre — Mr YU shared insights into the BEAM model he proposed: **B**elief and Value; **E**veryday Lifestyle; **A**rts and Creation; **M**emories and Tradition. He introduced the audience to the evolution of culture in the city with down-to-earth examples, such as *Yau-Tsim-Mong* cultures (denoting the districts of Yau Ma Tei, Tsim Sha Tsui, and Mong Kok), highlighting the intimate connections between lifestyle, artistic creation, and the collective memories that accumulate through time.

A copy of Mr YU's book on the same title (《城市如何文化》, published in July 2022), autographed for the College, has been added to the College's mini-library collection.



### Sharing on Exchange Experience and Introduction of U-Wide and College Exchange Programmes (6 October 2022)

In this session, Ms Frances SO, Assistant Programme Manager from the Office of Academic Links and Prof Andrew CHAN, Chair of the External Links and Exchange Committee introduced participants to U-wide and College Exchange Programmes (2023–24). Three CWC students who participated in physical exchange programmes in 2021–22 — Mr LIN Zhi Yuan (Year 4, Computer Science), Ms WONG Hoi Lam (Year 4, Biomedical Engineering) and Mr WONG Kwun Pok (Year 5, Psychology) — shared their experience gained in Switzerland, Singapore, and the Netherlands respectively.



# LANGUAGE AND CULTURE ENHANCEMENT

## Toastmasters Club Taster Sessions

Formed since the founding years, the College's Toastmasters Club Taster Sessions have become an established platform for students to hone their public speaking skills and to build confidence in front of an audience. The College has had the privilege to invite Ms Tessa STEWART, a long-time supporter of our Toastmasters initiatives, to join on multiple occasions as the General Evaluator.

The sessions, held on the dates as reported here, were supported by student coordinators (who are also avid participants themselves) and featured small group sharing and short impromptu speeches on selected topics. Participants received instant feedback on aspects such as voice, gestures and content, and made improvement over the sessions.

The hosts introduced Thanksgiving traditions and customs, as well as modern trends in the US (such as Black Friday and Cyber Monday), and hosted a Kahoot game of multiple-choice questions, with gifts for the winners. A classic American cartoon, *A Charlie Brown Thanksgiving*, was recommended to intrigue participants to explore more about Thanksgiving culture. 
### Lunar New Year DIY Handicraft (26 January 2022)

## COLLEGE ACTIVITIES

### Academic Year 2021–22

#### Amah Rock Hike (20 November 2021)

To encourage students to take a break from schoolwork, Resident Tutors Peggy WOH and Nicholas HO took a group of students to a 2.5-hour hike at Amah Rock in Shatin on 20 November 2021. The hikers enjoyed the autumn breeze and beautiful greenery along the way. The geological wonder — Amah Rock — that resembles a woman carrying a baby on her back was most breathtaking. Legend has it that the wife of a fisherman climbed the hills every day, carrying her son, to await her husband's return from the sea, not knowing he had already drowned. She was turned into a rock by the Goddess of the Sea for her faithfulness, so that her spirit could unite with her husband's.

#### Board Game Gathering (19 January 2022)

Board games is a great activity for getting together and stretching the mind. Our Resident Tutors hosted a small gathering on 19 January 2022 to introduce table-top games. Around 20 participants took part, playing Monopoly, Uno, Chess, Texas hold'em poker, and more.



#### 'Making the Festive Season Happier Series' (December 2021)

The College launched a series of post-semester activities for students to relax during the Christmas and New Year holidays.

##### Inter-floor Christmas Decoration Competition

The first event in the series was an inter-floor Christmas Decoration Competition. Residents and Tutors on each floor decorated the pantry areas in the Ina Ho Chan Un Chan Building. The design were based on specific themes, for instance, one of the 'I's in the College's Vision — intellectual, or on the meaning of Christmas. The College Master, the Dean of Students, and the Warden adjudicated the competition. The winning team of 12 students on the sixth floor and their Resident Tutor received supermarket cash coupons.



### Movie Nights — *Inside Out* and *Cruella*

Two lighthearted movies were screened at Chong Kin Wo Hall on 23 and 30 December 2021 for residents to wind down after the final examinations. Participants also received takeaway desserts like small cakes, cheese packs, crackers and grapes.



### Cycling on Boxing Day

On Boxing Day, Resident Tutors organised a cycling trip along the Shatin-Tai Po bike path. Participants enjoyed the breeze and scenic coastline of Tolo Harbour, state-of-the-art architecture in the Hong Kong Science Park, as well as the mountain vista of Ma On Shan and Pat Sin Leng from the Pak Shek Kok Promenade.



### Archi-Walk to Wanchai

Known to be one of the earliest developed districts in Hong Kong, Wanchai is a hidden treasure house with a diverse, multi-cultural community. It has a rich historical heritage and houses many contemporary constructions, creating a juxtaposition of old and new, traditional and modern. During the semester break, the College engaged the docent service of Hong Kong Architecture Centre to arrange for 20 participants a two-hour guided tour to the Blue House, Pak Tai Temple, the former Wanchai Post Office, Wanchai Market and Lee Tung Street. After the guided tour, participants formed groups of four to enjoy cuisine with cultural specialty.



### Term 1, Academic Year 2022–23

#### The Harvest Season: When will the Mushroom Fruit? (26 October and 14 November 2022)

Resident Tutor Dr XIE Yichun Rachel (Postdoctoral Fellow, School of Life Sciences) organised an educational workshop to introduce students to mushroom biology and its relevance to sustainable development, citing relevant research at CUHK. The workshop, in two parts, included a briefing on 26 October where participants first received edible mushroom blind boxes, and a harvest session on 14 November 2022 where participants then observed how the mushrooms had fruited, had fun creating art with mushroom spore prints, and shared experience cultivating mushrooms.



#### Kuk Po Valley ( 遊谷探埔 ) (5 November 2022)

College affiliate Prof Thomas CHUNG (Associate Professor, School of Architecture) and Resident Tutor Ms PO Ka Wai Karen (Research Assistant, School of Architecture) organised a visit on 5 November 2022 to Kuk Po ( 谷埔 ), a Hakka ( 客家 ) village in the northern part of Hong Kong with over 300 years of history. Participants joined a pre-tour briefing on 2 November, hosted by Prof CHUNG and Dr Joanna LEE (Professional Consultant, Department of Geography and Resource Management), to acquaint themselves with background knowledge that supplements the educational tour. The visit featured a leisurely hike from Luk Keng ( 鹿頸 ) to Kuk Po and a guided tour of the village. Participants appreciated natural landscape in the area and learnt about Hakka culture — about life of Hakka people in the past through the architecture, agricultural practices and cultural rituals — and enjoyed traditional Hakka food. They also learnt about a restoration work at Ng To ( 五肚 ), part of a countryside conservation project led by Prof CHUNG.

The 2021 CUHK Alumni Homecoming was held in hybrid mode on 27 November.
